

Mary Epting's eagle eye recently spotted this delightful bit of writing by Garrison Keillor, author and popular radio HI MON host of Minnesota Public Radio's A Prairie Home Companion from 1974-2016. Keillor, although a prickly, sometimes controversial individual, nevertheless was a gifted commentator about small-town life, using his fictitious Lake Wobegon as the center for his humor, much as Andy Griffith spun tails from Mayberry. A gifted humorist and musician, he was raised in the midst of Scandinavian Lutheranism, Minnesota style. This excerpt from his writings speaks of the Lutheran love of singing. Besides ruling the early Saturday evening spot on many Public Radio stations through the years, Keillor's show also traveled around the country, including a sold-out performance in Spartanburg.

### **THOUGHTS ON LUTHERANS - Garrison Keillor**

I have made fun of Lutherans for years - who wouldn't if you live in MN. But I have also sung with Lutherans, and that is one of the main joys in life, along with hot baths and fresh sweet corn. We make fun of Lutherans for their blandness, their excessive calm, their fear of giving offense, their constant guilt that burns like a pilot light, their lack of speed, and also for their secret fondness for macaroni and cheese.

But nobody sings like them. If you ask an audience in NYC, a relatively Lutheran-less place, to sing along on a chorus of 'Michael, Row the Boat Ashore', they will look daggers at you as if you had asked them to strip to their underwear. But if you do this among Lutherans, they'll smile and row that boat ashore, up too the beach, and down the road. Lutherans are bred from childhood to sing in four=part harmony; it is a talent that comes from sitting on the lap of someone singing alto or tenor or bass, and hearing the harmonic intervals by putting your little head against that person's ribcage. It is natural for Lutherans to sing in harmony, we're too modest to be soloists, too wordly to sing in unison, and when you're singing in the key of C and you slide into A-7th and D-7th chords, all 200 of you, it's an emotionally fulfilling moment. I once sang the bass line of 'Children of the Heavenly Father' in a room with about 3,000 Lutherans in it, and when we were finished, we all had tears in our eyes, partly from the promise that God will not forsake us, partly from the proximity of all those lovely voices. By our joining in harmony, we somehow promise that we will not forsake each other. I do believe this: people who love to sing in four-part harmony are the sort of people you could call up when you're in deep distress. If you're dying, they'll comfort you. If you're lonely, they'll talk to you. If you're hungry, they'll give you tuna salad.
