The Monthly Happenings @ the Mount deadline is the **18th of each month**. the first after the Epiphany, is the celebration of The Baptism of our Lord Jesus. His baptism by John the Baptist in the river Jordan marks the beginning of his public ministry. This year we will celebrate it on Sunday January 15th. The season of Epiphany will reach its climax on the festival of The Transfiguration of our Lord. This is the last Sunday in our season of Epiphany and it falls on February 19th. During our Lord's transfiguration we receive a glimpse, a foretaste of his Easter glory to come. This wonderful ancient season of the church serves as a bridge between the birth of our Lord and his passion. On the day of Epiphany, the first, and last Sunday of this season the paraments are white. White expresses light, glory, and holiness as our Lord begins his ministry and is transfigured upon the mountain. On the Sundays between the 1st and the last in Epiphany the color is green. This represents growing as we journey through Epiphany into a clearer vision of Christ's nature as the son of God manifest among us. The season of Epiphany is time which offers us challenges and opportunities for growth in Christ's love as we prepare for our Lenten Journey which looms ahead.

EXPERIENCING AND SHARING GOD'S PRESENCE

Rosemary Frick called the meeting to order at 11:18 am. The meeting was held in the sanctuary after the 10:00 am worship service.

Pastor Pat led the congregation in prayer.

Rosemary thanked the outgoing council members Benny Counts, Wil Hutchens, Derek Miller, Tim Schmidt and Mattie Smith. She presented them with a Certificate of Appreciation.

Rosemary presented the order of the agenda.

- 1. Approval of 2023 2025 Council Members.
- 2. A motion from the Council to approve the 2023 Ministry Plan with a Ballot vote.
- 3. Worship Service Survey to be given out and collected.
- 4. Power Point presentation of the Transition Process.

The 2023-2025 council nominees were introduced. No "At Large" nominees were received, and per our church constitution, the following were approved by council and are elected by acclamation. Travis Goodman, Katie Morgan, Cameron Prince and Laurie Schmidt will serve a three year term on Council.

Council voted to approve the 2023 Ministry Plan of \$585,500 at the October 9, 2022 Council Meeting. A motion was made and seconded from the congregation to approve the 2023 budget. Russ Burleson gave a brief overview of the Budget/Ministry Plan. There were no questions from the congregation. Ballots were distributed and collected to be counted. The motion to approve the 2023 Ministry Plan was passed with 99% in favor of and 1% not in favor.

Worship Service Surveys were distributed and collected. The results will be tabulated and discussed by Council at the December Council Meeting.

A Power Point presentation was given explaining the Transition Process of our church and where we are now in the transition.

We closed in prayer and the meeting was adjourned. Everyone was invited to the Fellowship Hall for the covered dish luncheon.
