A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR PAT

A Pastor shared this story; she writes I had just gone to a church service where nothing very dramatic happened. We all knew each other. The hymns were familiar, and we knew when to stand and when to sit. It was a comfortable way to spend an hour. I don't know what we would have done if the church had been filled suddenly with the sound of a rushing, mighty wind. Probably, we would have blamed the weather Bureau for not warning us that tumultuous weather should be expected.

The followers of Christ who gathered in a house on the day of Pentecost might have been filled with a bit more expectation.

Before his Ascension Jesus had charged them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "you heard from me, for John baptized with water, but before many days you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit." (Acts 1:4-5) They must have been a bit disquieted as they were religious people and Pentecost was a time of special sanctity, yet they remained locked up behind closed doors.

They would have participated in the other ways in which thanks was given for the yearly harvest. It is possible that the first Jewish Christians intended to honor God in the ordinary way that day, but the impression that comes from the first chapter of Acts is people waiting watching, and still somewhat apprehensive. Then it happened, when tongues of fire and a miraculous capacity for communication. The miraculous was a vehicle for the divine mystery but both miracle and mystery were to be shared. The Good News was not to be the foundation of a secret society in to which only a few could be initiated.

The Good News of Jesus Christ and his death and resurrection was for all and would be spread by people from the Jewish boondocks thickly accented Galilean accents. It would be heard by crowds from far more sophisticated places, and that very day some would hear and come to faith; indeed 3000 were added to the community of saints. As we celebrate this holy day let us recall in our Christian lives there is a consistent miracle that each of us is invited in our own tongue to participate and proclaim of our salvation in the name of Jesus Christ as we have also received the gift of the Holy Spirit.

- ⇒ Katie Morgan, council representative to the Pastoral Call Committee, reported that the Call Committee is working on preparing the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). This document will highlight Mt. Horeb's key points of ministry and serve as an introduction of who our church is to any potential call candidates. During this process, the committee will review the results of the Vitality Survey, gather demographic information of our community as well as meeting with members of the congregation in sharing sessions.
