Epiphany Ponderings...

The Epiphany of our Lord is January 6th. At Mt. Horeb we will celebrate this Holy day on Sunday January 7th as we remember the coming of the Magi who arrive bearing gifts for the baby Jesus. They bring to our Christ:

- Gold for a king.
- Frankincense as a fragrant offering for the one who is God among us.
- Myrrh for one who is to die for us.

So, what is afoot during this season seemingly stuck between Advent/ Christmas and Lent/Easter?

In western Christian tradition, January 6th is celebrated as the Epiphany of our Lord. It goes by other names in various church traditions. In Hispanic and Latin culture, as well as some places in Europe, it is known as Three Kings' Day.

Epiphany Day is the culmination of the Advent/ Christmas Season and the Twelve Days of Christmas, which are usually counted from the evening of December 25th until the morning of January 6th, which is the Twelfth Day. Happenings @ the Mount deadline is the **18th of each month**.

Epiphany means manifestation or reveal. The season of Epiphany revolves around the manifestation or revelation of God in and through Jesus Christ to the world. We celebrate and remember the visit to Jesus by the Magi. The first Sunday after the Epiphany (which we will celebrate January 14th) is the celebration of the Baptism of our Lord which marks the beginning of his public ministry. The last Sunday in the season of Epiphany this year is February 11th when we commemorate the Transfiguration of our Lord. Upon Mount Tabor as our Lord is transfigured before us, we receive a glimpse, a foretaste of his Easter glory to come. Epiphany can have as few as four Sundays and as many as nine Sundays depending upon the arrival of Ash Wednesday. This ancient season of the church, Epiphany, serves as a bridge between the birth of our Lord and his passion. On the Epiphany of Lord, his Baptism and Transfiguration the paraments are white expressing light, glory, victory, holiness, and celebration as our Lord receives the Magi, begins his ministry, and later is transfigured before us on the mountain.

On Sundays between the first and the last Sunday our paraments are green as we grow during this season in a clearer vision of Christ and his nature as the son of God manifest among us. The season of Epiphany is one which offers us challenges and opportunities to grow in Christ and his love. We respond in faith to his grace that is manifest as we shine the light of the gospel unto all the nations.




